

*Jullyen was not specialty trained; he was just well broke to ride, with solid knowledge — a correct turnaround (spin), change of leads, etc. — and useful manners. Initially skeptical, Hart became a believer as the bay stallion answered each of his requests willingly. By the end of the day, Hart wanted *Jullyen el Jamaal for western pleasure at Scottsdale and the Nationals.

And so a performance career appears to be opening for *Jullyen, whose one previous show experience was as unanimous Champion Stallion at Region II in 2004. But Sheila Varian is quick to caution that her horse's primary focus will remain as a breeding stallion. What has he accomplished so far? Just what she asked of him: He has left a gentle mark, blending his outcross blood into the Varian program to continue it on seamlessly.

Her goals? Those haven't changed over the years; they are based on the first lesson she learned when she fell in love with Arabians through the books of Walter Farley. "I want to continue breeding Arabian horses that look like the ideal Arabian horse," she says, "and perform at the level of the top quality horses in any breed."
